

January 1, 2023

Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God

“And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart.”

The Blessed Virgin Mary is born to be Mother, and her vocation as Mother of Christ extends to every Christian. We “receive adoption” and enjoy the new life of grace because of her fruitful virginity, for she gave birth to the Savior. The Lord wills to “let his face shine upon” us through the Mother of God. On the cross the Lord says, “Behold, your mother” (Jn 19:27), as “proof that we are sons.”

Beginning the year with this solemnity reveals that “devotion to this sweet Mother is not something superficial or intermittent, consisting of isolated practices with a special place and hour in our day, but constant and essential, reaching to the very depths of our hearts and filling our whole beings and our lives like a heavenly perfume” (Abp. Luis Martínez).

The Dignity and Power of the Mother of God, Divine motherhood is an immense power in the world of grace, the greatest power after the redemptive power of Christ. These words, expressing at the same time the greatest human endearment and an overwhelming sense of irresistible warlike power, have been always applied to the blessed Mother of God by the Christian liturgy.

In practice the Catholic Church looks upon the Mother of God as being an unbounded power in the realm of grace; in virtue of her divine motherhood Mary is simply the most vast, the most efficient, the most universal supernatural power in heaven and on earth, outside the three Divine Persons.

The Epiphany of the Lord

The Magi – according to tradition, Balthasar, Melchior, and Caspar – journeyed very far to find the Child Jesus. Do we seek Jesus with this same intensity?

Jesus wants us to find Him in everything. Every day, He wants us to grow in the awareness of His loving Presence and providence in all of the circumstances of our lives.

Jesus calls us to holiness, to closeness with Him. He reaches out, taking us by the hand, to a relationship with Him, leading us to eternal life.

The Magi did not only seek the Lord, but they also FOUND Him, and then they gave Him meaningful presents. However, we might ask, what do we have of any value to offer God? Echoing the words from “In the Bleak Mid-winter,” we can say, “What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; if I were a Wise Man I would do my part. Yet what I can I give Him? Give my heart.”

Today, as a gift to the Lord, we can offer Him our hearts, our minds, our wills. We can rejoice in having found Him, and with the Wise Men adore Him in our hearts.

Throughout our Advent and Christmas reflections, we have been seeking to better know and love the Lord, our Beloved One who always loves us FIRST: this day, this moment, always! May God bless you throughout 2023, and may the Baby Jesus always live in your heart.
