Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 7, 2021

“Rising very early before dawn, Jesus went off to a deserted place.”

In today's Gospel we learn that Simon had a mother-in-law. In other words, we become aware that when Simon left everything behind to follow Jesus, that “everything” included family. Jesus the Healer cured Simon's mother-in-law and many in the town who were sick. Yes, Jesus responds to the universal longing for wholeness and healing. WORDS OF POPE FRANCIS
