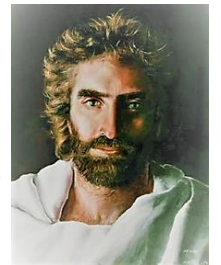

March 27, 2022 -- Fourth Sunday of Lent



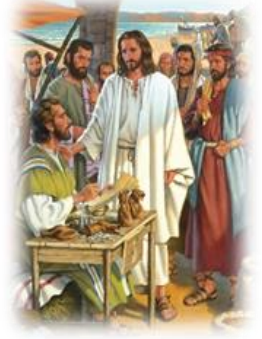
The Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, “this man welcomes sinners and eats with them.”

“Whoever is in Christ is a new creation. God has reconciled us to himself through Christ. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.” What is it that finally moves the prodigal son to return home?

His hunger. Experiencing his own poverty, he remembers where he can find “more than enough”—his father’s house. At first, believing that his father will feed him merely as he feeds his household servants, the son sets out. He goes hoping for scraps of manna, yet he is received like the Israelites into the Promised Land and set before a feast. Dressed in the effects of the Father’s own authority, we “become the righteousness of God.” God’s love for us is even greater than we imagine.

April 3, 2022 -- Fifth Sunday of Lent

On this final Sunday before Holy Week, Christ looks at us as he looks at the woman caught in adultery, offering the forgiveness of our sins. Even if we are brought to shame before those of this world, we can have confidence in the mercy of Jesus, who will not condemn us.

Because she did not run away, she gained “the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus” as her Lord. We accept the loss of all things, “considering them so much rubbish” compared to friendship with Jesus. We “remember not the events of the past,” we have a new life with Christ, we have “been taken possession of by Christ Jesus,” who says to us, “Go, and from now on do not sin anymore.”

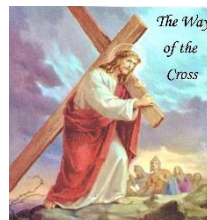
