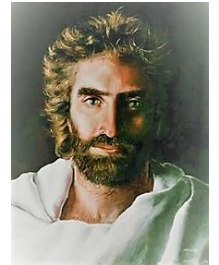

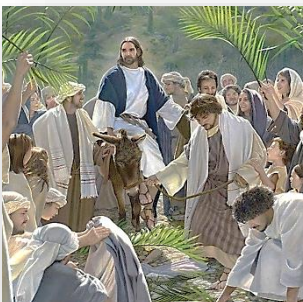

# April 10, 2022 - Palm Sunday



***Be aware of the call for all followers of Jesus to be ready...to be ready to face the same struggle against evil that he did, and with the same measure of love.***

“In the palm procession our heart feels a joy mixed with sadness at sight of the Master’s seemingly ephemeral triumph, prelude of suffering and death” (Archbishop Luis Martinez). Today’s Mass recognizes that Jesus’ full glory and kingship would only come about when he was lifted up. Our greatest sorrow and shame is our great relief—the cross. Jesus’ experience of being loved and hated, of being welcomed and then rejected, provides us strength to endure the caprices and injustices of our own life.

On this day the Church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. Accordingly, the memorial of this entrance of the Lord takes place at all Masses, by means of the Procession or the Solemn Entrance before the principal Mass or the Simple Entrance before other Masses.

## **Living Stewardship- Pillar of Prayer**

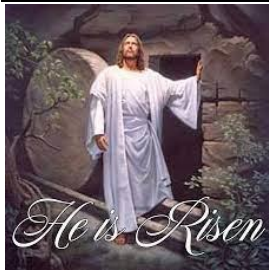

# April 17, 2022 - Easter Sunday

*The Lord is truly risen, Alleluia. To him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia*

“Jesus is risen from the dead! This message resounds in the Church the world over, along with the singing of the Alleluia. He remained two days in the tomb; but his death contained God’s love in all its power; released and made manifest on the third day, the day we celebrate today: the Easter of Christ the Lord. The words heard by the women at the tomb are also addressed to us: Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Death, solitude and fear are not the last word. There is a word that transcends them, a word that only God can speak: it is the word of the Resurrection (Pope Francis). Christ has made good on all he promised. He is truly risen.

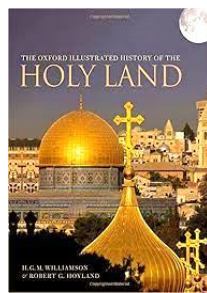
