Because the Passion of our Lord is over 2,000 words long, the tradition of standing during its reading has given way to being seated so that the congregation may better concentrate. Some seniors find standing for a long time becomes a physical challenge. With the assignment of readers for the various parts in the narrative, in some churches, this Gospel can become a production complete with costumes and other special effects.

The challenge at Mass today should be to not get too comfortable while listening to the horrible brutal death Jesus endured for us. He paid the price for us. What can we do for him?



INCLUDING YOUTH

If we were somehow able to witness a Roman crucifixion, especially one preceded by a horrific, brutal scourging, we would probably throw up. Today, brutal executions are routinely perpetuated by repressive governments, crime mobs, human traffickers and gangs. Would you be willing to pray (and not just a 5-second quick prayer) or do an act of penance for those about to be victimized?

If asked, "Do you want to be like Jesus?" most people would automatically answer "yes." From the agony and injustice of the cross, Jesus asked that the people who put him there be forgiven. What is our track record on forgiving people who mistreat us?

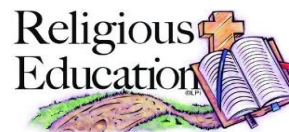
