THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH WILL GUIDE YOU TO ALL TRUTH

Before mountains, stars, springs and seas, before the foundations of the earth, you were there, as three, as one, in the eternity of your now. Spirit, thank you for the gift of knowing the truth of the Father (who gave us his Son) the Son (who gave us his life) and the Holy Spirit (who lives in our hearts as our constant companion). Oh, please guide us to the truth in all things.

CONNECTIONS

Do you recall a few years back when the Mass was revised, and we started saying “consubstantial” – a tongue-twisting word that was hard to say and even harder to understand. Today, consubstantial easily rolls off our tongue each time we recite the Creed. Webster’s definition of that word, “of the same substance,” can give us insight into the Trinity. We might think of our bodies and how our head, hand and foot are all different, but still parts of the same body.

If we were sculpting an image of the Trinity, the Father, Son and Spirit would all be formed from the same clay. All three persons are uniquely different, but still consubstantial.

Reflections

HOLY WISDOM

Today we celebrate the Trinity's work for our salvation. God the Father is the beginning. The work continues with the sending of the Son, Jesus, the Christ, who lives among us as the way, the truth and the life. Then the Spirit of Truth comes to lead us to the complete truth.

Out of love, God sanctifies us in his family. Holy wisdom delights in the Trinity's great work on our behalf. We nourish ourselves with word and sacrament as we follow Jesus' way to the Father. Glory be to the *Father* and to the *Son* and to the *Holy Spirit*. As it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be world without end. Amen.

INCLUDING YOUTH

This excerpt from the Gospel of John is an opportunity to pose questions that pique the interest of youth. The future is certainly coming – would you want to know yours ahead of time? How much of it? Only the good parts? Only the painful parts?

What do you think Jesus meant by saying, “you cannot bear it now” and that Spirit of truth “will guide you to all truth”? Would you (or do you) want to know the truths about yourself that you might now like to hear? They are still truths. Will you ask the Spirit to lead you to know and understand them? How strongly do we believe Jesus’ promise of the Spirit?

IT TOOK A LONG TIME TO GET DAD'S SPECIAL DAY RECOGNIZED

The First Father's Day

On July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church hosted the nation's first event explicitly in honor of fathers. During a Sunday sermon, 362 men who had died in explosions in December at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah were honored in a one-time commemoration.

One year later, Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, tried to create a "Mother's Day" for fathers. She had success when Washington state held the first statewide Father's Day on July 19, 1910.

The road to declaring a nationally honored Father's Day was a long one, spanning over 60 years. President Calvin Coolidge supported the holiday but did not make a proclamation. President Woodrow Wilson spoke at a Father's Day celebration in Spokane, Washington, but Congress resisted making the holiday official out of fear it would become commercialized. Finally, President Lyndon B. Johnson was the one who declared the third Sunday in June as Father's Day, though it was not yet made a permanent national holiday. Finally, it was President Nixon who officially declared it a holiday in 1972.
