SET YOUR FAITH ON FIRE

... Seeing how a person responds to someone whose particular gifts he or she is unaware of, without scorning or ridiculing that person, helps set my Faith on fire.

... My Faith has been set on fire by a person who is supportive of a friend or relative who needs people to believe in them through a difficult time.

... The memory of my mother befriending a woman who was divorced and remarried, in the days when it was common for a person in that situation to be made a pariah, helps keep my faith on fire.

*It takes time to come to the fire,
it takes effort to keep the fire burning,
it takes a willingness to become quiet enough to
hear what God might be saying, and
it takes courage to snuff out competing sounds
and demands that attempt
to shorten or neutralize the effect of the fire

Allow God to stir up a faith-fire within you that not only encourages you with the warmth of His presence, but also spreads like wildfire to others.

SUNDAY REFLECTIONS CONNECTION

“It is a challenge to teach about the oceans to students living on flat plains in the middle of a country, especially if they have not had the opportunity to travel to a coastline. You might try to have them imagine a familiar lake as if it went on for hundreds and hundreds of miles to the right and left and straight across.



In the same way, Jesus used parables --- *as if* stories – to help people understand the ways of God. Preachers are challenged to do that every Sunday. Each of us is also challenged to come up with our own *as if* stories to share our faith with family and friends. It is possible we might appreciate the Sunday preaching more when we try to do it ourselves.

INCLUDING YOUTH

“We walk by faith, not by sight,” Paul wrote. Yet many people, perhaps especially the young, after agreeing with the statement, ask, “Well, yeah, but how do we know that ...?” It is accurate enough to say that faith is a “knowing” of a different type but that response may not be satisfying by itself to most youth. Ask these questions: How do you know – absolutely 100 percent know – that your girlfriend/boyfriend likes you? Or that this morning’s cereal will not be recalled for containing harmful elements? Or that the sun will really last another 5 billion years? We take countless things on faith. If we insisted on proof of everything, we could not get out of bed.

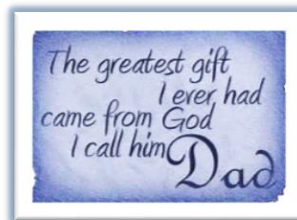
