He doesn't spend time *talking* about his mission. He spends his time *living* his mission. St. Joseph can help us combat the "Slacktivism" so rampant in our digital world today where we are more likely to share a post about social change rather than spending our energy on enacting those changes. Joseph reminds us the *real* work often goes unnoticed.

Faith present in your heart is Jesus Christ present. Watchful faith is Jesus Christ watching. Sleeping faith is Jesus Christ asleep.
