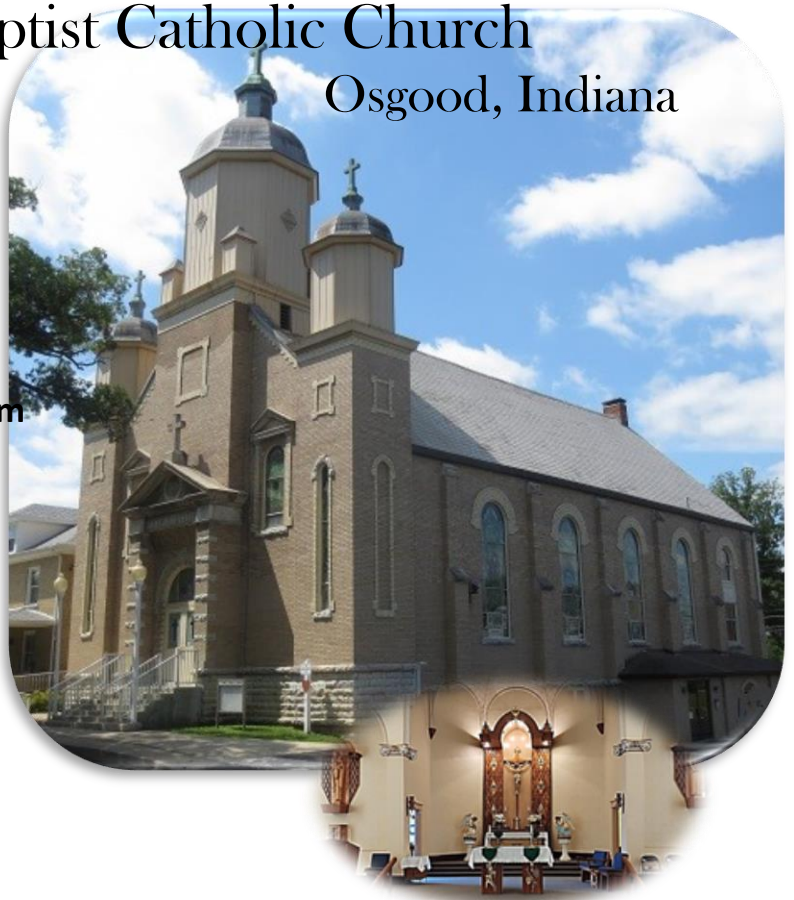

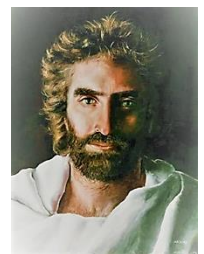
**"Welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you for the glory of God"**

"No, not yet," says the policeman. "The floor is still wet!"

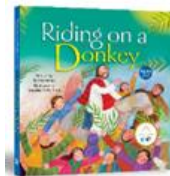
## Children's Summer Reading

This collection of Bible stories will excite young readers about the great adventure God has in store for those who love him.

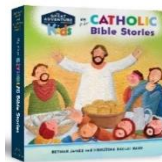


### Riding on a Donkey (Ages 3-7)
