SUNDAY REFLECTIONS CONNECTION

Where is the deserted place that Jesus invited you to come away to in today's Gospel?

It may be a very ordinary space like the porch or the bench under a tree in the park or the backyard. Often, what makes the space deserted is the time of day – either early morning, during a child's nap time or later at night. It is likely that we have to create the deserted quality by turning off phones and other devices.

It is not surprising that there is a little twist in the Gospel. When Jesus and the disciples reach their deserted place, the crowd is already there waiting for them. This requires patience and resolve; patience with the crowd and resolve to keep creating deserted places.

INCLUDING YOUTH

Ask how many young people are going into shepherding after high school or are majoring in shepherding at college. There are still shepherds today. In the U.S., most are from Latin America on temporary work visas and work on sheep ranches in the American West. Sadly, the average pay is about \$1,800 per month. (*America's Food: What You Don't Know About What You Eat*, by Harvey Blatt) American youth would prefer to flip burgers, but they may be shepherds of a different kind: fathers and mothers shepherd their children; coaches shepherd teams; team captains shepherd teammates; teachers shepherd students; counselors shepherd clients. The time to begin preparing to be a good shepherd is now, it reflects God's love to us! Thank you. May God continue to bless you with His abundant gifts!

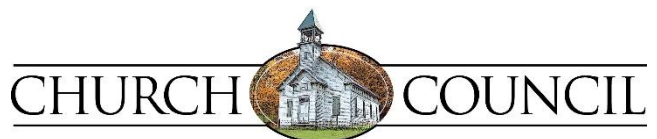
STEWARDSHIP
