

August 29, 2020 – The Passion of Saint John the Baptist

St John the Baptist was the forerunner of the Messiah both in life and in death., He leaped in the womb and later preached the repentance that prepared the way for Christ. Then, by dying for the truth, he prepared the way for the Lord's Passion. John the Baptist was, through and through, a "righteous and holy man," and the Gospel for August 29th reveals that Herod, even while being rebuked, "liked to listen to him." This can only be accounted for by the Baptist's great love. All of us find in John the Baptist an inspiration to live with courageous love. "Life," as Pope Francis once preached on this day, "has value only in giving it, in giving it in love, in truth, in giving it to others, in daily life, in the family."

God labors for us so that we might work for Him. Gently, the Lord encourages us to take up the cross of our baptismal initiation and follow Jesus. This encouragement takes many forms tailored to each of our weaknesses and strengths. By pushing us, encouraging us, and helping us, the Lord points us toward the goal of salvation. Jesus seeks us out; he pulls us toward him by many paths. *Be quiet and feel his tug!*

When Peter tries to deny the Lord his Passion—"God forbid that such a thing every happen to you!"—the Lord rebukes him. Why? Because Christ's death on the cross would fulfill the "good and pleasing and perfect" will of the Father for our salvation. In union with Jesus, we offer our bodies

as a living sacrifice to God. And no matter how much our sharing in Christ's cross may make us an object of the world's laughter and mockery, the love of God is like a fire burning in our heart. "True glory is the glory of love because that is the only kind that gives life to the world" (Pope Francis). It is the life-giving of love which Christ reveals on the cross.
