

There was a rich man...and lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus

One of the most shocking parts of today's parable is the way the rich man, even in the afterlife, still speaks of the poor man as a servant who is supposed to do his bidding: "Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue."

"Woe to the complacent in Zion," the prophet says. That complacency is not only a refusal to share material goods—it is a self-obsession, a total ignoring of someone, a giving-up on another as unworthy to exist except if he or she is useful to us. We are called to "pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness." "The King of kings and Lord of lords" loves us and suffered for us, so that we can in turn love and care for the poor, needy, and burdened in our life.

"When you have done all you have been commanded, say, we are unprofitable servants, we have done what we were obliged to do."

In order to comply with the apostles' request, "Increase our faith," the Lord begins by correcting their conception of it. Faith increases in those who are truly humble, who acknowledge that, before the Lord, they ever remain "unprofitable servants." Faith increases when we are willing to bear our "share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God." Faith of this intensity, even if only as small as a mustard seed, makes miracles happen, and even more: it "presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint," for faith leads to eternal life. "The just one, because of his faith, shall live."

We have received everything from God, which is why Jesus invites us to have the attitude of humble servants. He uses an example that is clear to his listeners: a servant works hard all day and then comes home and prepares and serves dinner. We have no place being proud or demanding before God because all we have is from Him; life, family, health, our talents. All are His gifts to us.
