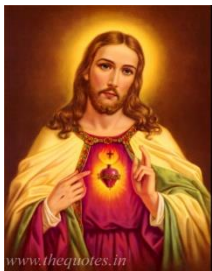

SUNDAY REFLECTIONS CONNECTIONS

In the U.S. the top 1 percent of households own more wealth than the bottom 90 percent combined! One billion children worldwide are living in poverty. According to UNICEF, 22,000 children die each day due to poverty.



Jesus told the man who wanted to inherit eternal life, "Go sell what you have and give to the poor." Pope Francis has said, giving to the poor is our "passport to paradise."

Millionaire Brian Burnie sold his \$26 million estate to fund a charity to fly cancer patients to hospitals. Investor Zell Kravensky gave away over \$45 million and even donated his own kidney to a stranger. Today's Gospel is an "inconvenient truth" that can speak to all of us.

INCLUDING YOUTH

If asked whom they know or knew personally who exhibited true wisdom, most youths would likely mention grandparents. Build on this. Ask them to consider how they think grandparents became wise – and at what point in life did they begin.



In today's Gospel, Jesus' words fly in the face of our society's cult of affluence. They need not be taken as a blanket statement that, in order to be a good person today, one must join a monastery or become a missionary. A point that stands a chance of being considered is, "in all raw honesty...do you own your (digital, wireless) possessions or do they own you

STEWARDSHIP

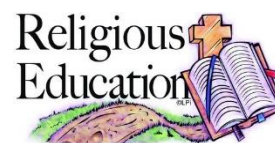
In today's Gospel, Jesus asks the rich young man to give away all that he has in order to have treasure in heaven.
