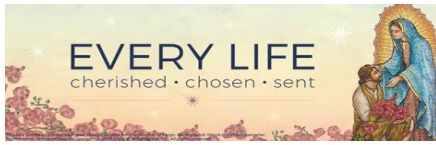

SUNDAY REFLECTIONS CONNECTIONS

Throughout history in the East and the West, various cultures worshipped multiple gods: the Egyptians, the Greeks, the Romans, etc. To number them all, it would count in the thousands. Somehow, civilization devised a god for all occasions.

In today's Gospel, Jesus declares, "The Lord our God is Lord alone!" with the admonition to love the Lord with all our hearts, souls, minds and strength. In our world today, we may worship other gods of money, possessions, power and prestige. We may profess one God, but we still have other gods of addiction and distractions that dilute our faith.

INCLUDING YOUTH

Ask anyone, especially students, to raise their hands if they have ever heard the "Shema, Israel,"



which proclaims the essence of the Jewish tradition. Explain that they have heard it twice in the past several minutes: "Hear, O Israel..."

Just as John 3:16, "For God so loved the world..." is often considered the central verse of the Christian Scripture, the "Shema" is often considered the central verse/concept of the Hebrew Scripture.

If youths were composing a "scriptural" rallying cry for their children, something that summarizes what they would like to pass on and have future generations live by, what would it be?

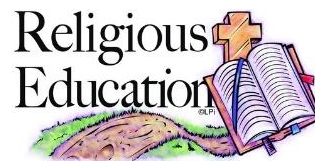
