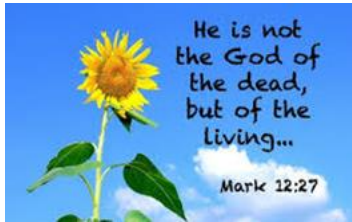

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

*To be a witness to Jesus is to be like the first apostles,
a witness to his resurrection*

The seven brothers who bravely approach their martyrdom in the second book of Maccabees have a better sense of life after death than the Sadducees with their absurd hypothesis about seven deceased brothers. One martyred brother, filled with conviction, declares, “The King of the world will raise us up to live again forever.” Jesus verifies this: “Those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age no longer die; they are like angels.” God is not the God of the dead but of the living, for to him all are alive.” And until we reach the place of eternal life, “May our Lord Jesus Christ encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ.”

We pray together in the Nicene Creed, “I look forward to the resurrection of the dead.” We live life on this earth once, die once and are judged once. Jesus is the resurrection and the life” We hope that one day we will rise with him, even if on earth our lives are “hidden with Christ in God” (Colossians 3:3) To be a witness to Jesus is to be like the first apostles, a witness to his resurrection. The living God who called Abraham, Isaac and Moses is the same God who sent his Son, raised him from the dead and who calls us to follow him and rise up to be with him forever.

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the readings prepare us for the conclusion of our earthly pilgrimage. Jesus describes the end times in today's Gospel. He warns us not to follow false prophets who will arise and claim to come in his name. He prophesies a time of war, natural disasters, famines and plagues. Persecution will fall upon his followers, allowing them the change to give testimony—*martyrion* in Greek.

We don't know when the end times may come. But regardless, our call is to live prepared by fulfilling God's will and trusting in him. Jesus clearly wants us to be aware of the coming of the end of the world and the eventual end of our lives on this earth, but he does not want us to be overly anxious. If we are in Christ, we are already a new creation. The old has passed away. Behold the new has come. Be not afraid!

National Vocation

Awareness Week

Celebrated

November 6-12, 2022

is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. NVAW began in 1976 when the U. S. bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.
