SUNDAY REFLECTIONS CONNECTIONS

The Mayan women enter the church at Santiago Atitlán. Inside, they sing and pray together in a humbling display of faith. Some of the older women still remember their former



pastor, Blessed Fr. Stan Rother. Though born in Oklahoma, his heart belonged to his Guatemalan parish. In 1981, he gave his life to it when a death squad assassinated him. As Pope Francis would say, "He 'smelled' like the sheep." Some of us are like the widow in today's Gospel. We quietly put our "two coins" into the Temple offering. Others, while glancing to be sure they are noticed, flash money into the passing basket. For the humble, like Blessed Fr. Stan, sainthood is in the offering.

INCLUDING YOUTH

God had "designated" a widow in Zarephath to aid Elijah. Virtually anyone else would seemingly have been a better choice for the job, but Elijah trusted in God. Encourage youth to reflect: Has anyone been your "widow" (woman or man) – an unlikely source of aid or inspiration? It could be someone you know personally or have heard about.



Scribes loved to seek out glory while devouring "the houses of widows" – pushing those already down and socially powerless even further down. Today's down and socially powerless "widows" might include the unpopular, minority groups, immigrants, or those who seem less gifted.
